- CAN ONLY BE MODIFIED BY MUTUAL
 CONSENT OF CLASS AND PROFESSOR
- ONE EXCEPTION: I CAN MAKE UNILATERAL MODIFICATIONS THAT WORK TO YOUR ADVANTAGE; YOU CANNOT

COMMUNITY OF LEARNING

- WE ARE ON AN INTELLECTUAL JOURNEY TOGETHER
 - ☐ NOT AN OCCASION FOR GRANDSTANDING, BULLYING, PROSELYTIZING, OR CONDEMNING
 - ☐ NOT AN OPPORTUNITY FOR YOU TO TRY TO DISCOVER WHAT I THINK
 - THIS NOT ABOUT BEING RIGHT; IT IS ABOUT EXPLORING WHAT MIGHT BE RIGHT
- THE TAPESTRY OF OUR CONVERSATION IS CENTRAL

ARGUMENTS

- AN ARRANGEMENT OF STATEMENTS SUCH THAT SOME SUPPORT OR ENTAIL OTHERS
 - PREMISES: THE STATEMENTS DOING THE ENTAILING
 - CONCLUSION: THE STATEMENT THUS ENTAILED
- ARGUMENTS ARE ABOUT CONNECTING PREMISES AND CONCLUSIONS
- IN THIS COURSE, ARGUMENTS HAVE TO BE GROUNDED IN THE TEXT: ARGUMENTS ABOUT ARGUMENTS

ARGUMENT RULES

- 1. ENGAGE THE ARGUMENT, NOT THE PERSON
- 2. MAKE SURE THAT YOU HAVE THE ARGUMENT
- 3. EVERY ALTERNATIVE SHOULD BE CONSIDERED
- 4. THE PRINCIPLE OF CHARITY: ASSUME THAT OTHERS ARE MAKING AN ARGUMENT RATHER THAN JUST SOUNDING OFF

THEORY

- A WAY OF SEEING
- CAN BE USED AT LEAST TWO WAYS:
 - EXPLANATORY ARGUMENTS (VALIDITY)
 - ☐ ETHICAL ARGUMENTS (SOUNDNESS)
- BOTH NEED PRIOR KNOWLEDGE ABOUT THE
 THEORIES THEMSELVES

THEORY

- BASIC CHARACTERISTICS:
 - ABSTRACT/IDEALIZED
 - GENERAL (DEFINITIONS, CAUSES)
 - ☐ CATEGORICAL
- YOU CAN'T NOT HAVE A THEORY!

THEORIZING

- "WORLD POLITICS"
- "INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS"
- "INTERNATIONAL POLITICS"
- "FOREIGN POLICY"

THE GREAT CONVERSATION

- THINKING THEORETICALLY ABOUT WORLD POLITICS...
 - ABOUT POLITICS...
 - ...A SUBSET OF THINKING THEORETICALLY
- DEOPLE HAVE BEEN TALKING ABOUT THESE ISSUES FOR A LONG, LONG TIME

THE GREAT CONVERSATION

- OUR CONCERNS ARE ALREADY SHAPED BY THAT CONVERSATION...
- ☐ ...ESPECIALLY BY THE EUROPEAN/U.S. PART OF THAT CONVERSATION
 - (IN NO SMALL PART BECAUSE OF EUROPEAN/ U.S. IMPERIALISM/COLONIALISM)
- PREPARING TO ENTER THE CONVERSATION
 MORE DELIBERATELY
